The area is well-served by public transport. The 824 and 825 routes stop directly outside Moorabbin railway station on the Nepean Hwy side. The 811 and 812 routes stop along South Rd, just before Nepean Hwy, next to the Kingston Arts Centre. Moorabbin railway station is on the Frankston train line and the station is within easy walkingdistance of the Centre, 100 metres away.

There is a taxi rank directly outside Moorabbin station.

The venue is access friendly, with wheelchair accessible toilets on the ground floor and a lift up to the Theatre on Level 1, equipped with a hearing loop.


