## Here//There



**Artist Michelle Merrifield has made ceramic sculptures for her exhibition *Here//There*.**

Fish are used in stories across different cultures. They symbolise journeys, growth, transformation, food, water and mystery. How can one creature carry so much meaning? Keep reading to find out more!

*Many of these artworks are fish or include fish. Can you count how many?*

## Identity & Belonging



Just as fish belong to schools or migrate between waters, we can reflect on where they belong.

Look at the sculpture to the left, titled *Fish out of Water*.

*Have you ever been somewhere new where you didn't know anyone, or had to try something that felt strange or hard?*

That feeling is what people mean when they say 'a fish out of water.' A fish needs water to live, so if it's out of water, it feels lost and out of place.

## Adaptability



Fish move with currents. The artist has created feet on this gold fish sculpture titled *Fred*. Feet on a fish suggest change, something evolving to survive in a new environment. It could symbolise resilience, adaptability, or the courage to step into the unknown.

A fish belongs in water, so what happens when it walks on land? Maybe instead of feeling out of place, it's about finding new possibilities.

## Environmental Awareness



Fish highlight the importance of water, ecosystems, and caring for our planet. In *Transpose*, each of the three men carry fish, connecting humankind and the earth. They invite you to close your eyes and journey inward, to find restoration and feel peace in the present moment.

*Perhaps you could go outside to spend time in nature? Listen to the birds and outdoor sounds. Think about how fish need clean water to swim and birds need leafy trees and clean air.*

*Take a chance to discover the peace that lies within you and within all of us.*
